Demographics

Johnson Middle School is designated as a Title I School due to the percentage of students classified as low income. As a result, we receive Title I Funds—federal resources aimed at enhancing our existing programs to support student success. In compliance with state requirements, this policy outlines our intentional plan for engaging parents and families in the educational process.

Annual Title 1 Meeting

An annual meeting will be held to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, to explain the Title I requirements, and the right of parents to be involved. Johnson Middle School will invite all parents and will encourage them to attend.

Parent Meetings and Involvement
